We live confined to our bodies we depend on it, whatever type of body that is; days go by and it deteriorates, we try to control it and make it work for us. Our physonomy is a character apart from ourselves through which we exist.


It is impossible not to feel empathy for someone like Fede, a man who has difficulty performing simple tasks like tying his shoelaces, jumping o simply going for a walk. This made me reconsider the concept between near and far.

The film tells the story of a prisoner confined to his body who finally finds the strength to rebel. His body exiled him from human contact.

It also is a story about love and friendship. Fede only wants to be understood; he did not want to overcome his weight, he lived his life according to who he was and despite of living isolated from human contact he had not lost his ability to be surprized. This is the most imporant part of the film and his personality.

It is a simple story filled with 'light', a story made up of those small significant moments in our lives: making a new friend, looking at old photos, realizing your parents live on although they are not here, realizing you were in love, taking pictures of something you find interesting or beautiful, walking outside, going through your home as if you were someone else, watch the sun set from your favorite sofa.

Sometimes we discover we were locked in so long that when we step out, even for a moment (it's always just a moment) we realize that one life is not enough to discover all the wonders and experiences of this world. My wish is to capture such moments of clarity to share with the audience.



ALEJANDRO GUZMAN, BIOFILMOGRAPHY

Born in Los Mochis, Sinaloa, December 4th, 1973. In 1996 he begins his studies at the Centro de Capacitacion Cinematográfica where he directed several short films that were screened around the world.

He received the Audience Award in the 8th Photography Bienniel of Mexico. Professionally he directed the second unit of the feature films *Pasotrela, The Crime of Cacaro Gumaro* and *Belzebuth*. He has directed television programs for Clío TV and was head of the news program, *NotiPemex.*

Alejandro is a professor at the School of Dramatic Literature and and Theatre, where he teaches a Film Screenplay and Film and Television Direction workshops, and at the Centro de Capacitación Cinematográfica. In 2012 he wrote and directed a theatrical piece *The wait* for the theatre company *Teatro en una Cascara de Nuez*. He directed and produced the animated miniseries 12 for the web. *Walking Distance* is his first feature film.

Mexico City, June 13, 1980. The screenplay *Distancias Cortas* received support from the Mexican Film Institute's (IMCINE) Creator's Fund and was published by IMCINE and Ed. Buen Tina in 2012.

She received an invitation to participate as a playwright in the workshops of the Royal Court of London, and became an international resident of that institution in March 2013. She received the Young Artist Fund from the National Fund for Culture and Arts (FONCA) in dramaturgy (2008-2009) and received an internship at TV Azteca writer's center.

Itzel holds a BA in Communication from the National Autonomous University of Mexico (UNAM), specializing in written journalism. Her career in dramaturgy was developed with professors such as Hugo Argüelles, Ximena Esclante, David Olguín and Marco Antonio de la Parra, among others.

In 2013 the editorial Le Miroir qui Fume published her play *Anatomía de la Gastritis* (Anatomy of gastritis) translated by David Ferré.


Her work has also been published by the editorials, El Milagro, Los textos de la Capilla, second generation, Tierra Adentro, Buena Tinta and the magazine Este País.
